APPROVAL OF MINUTES The November minutes were approved with corrections as moved and seconded by Herre and S. Myers respectively. One correction noted was that the deadline for nominations for the CSI Outstanding Chapter Award was not December 12, 2006 as reported, but was December 15, 2006. December 12, 2006 was the deadline to get the nomination to Jeff Snyder, the Chapter Awards Committee Chairman. The other correction noted was that the new web site at www.cpc-csi.org is not yet functioning.
