## Speaker Bio

### "The Nuts and Bolts of Mentoring"

Our industry is facing an unprecedented exodus as baby boomers begin to retire and take their knowledge with them. The influx of new professionals into the industry make the idea of formal mentoring programs a timely topic. This presentation will define the roles of mentor and protégé and discuss reasons why experienced and emerging professionals need each other. A brief history of mentoring and discussion of the different types of mentor-protégé relationships in a professional office will be followed by an overview of the mentoring program in the Baltimore office of Design Collective, Inc. which is entering its fourth year.

Marvin Kemp, AIA, CSI, CDT is a Senior Associate in the Baltimore office of Design Collective, Inc. and is a member of the firm's Education Committee. 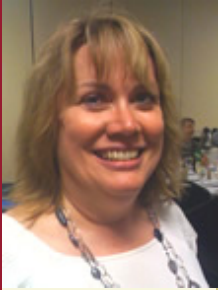

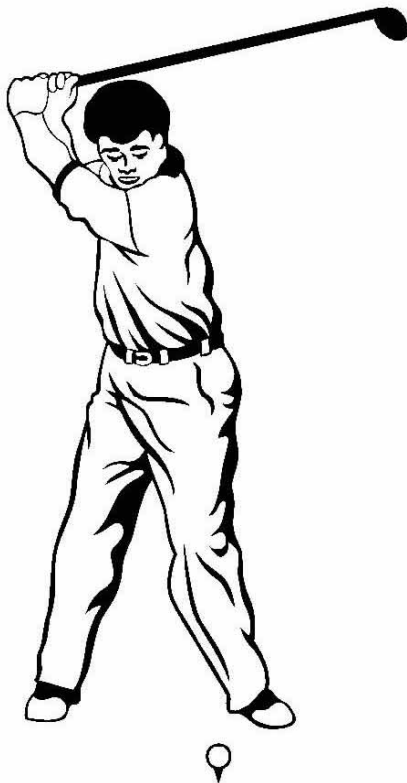
