## President's Message

"You taught, didn't you?" Imagine my surprise at being confronted by that question in Chicago from a woman whom I did not at first recognize on the exhibit floor at CONSTRUCT 2011, the Institute's National Convention. "I passed my CDT!", she next proudly exclaimed. It turns out that Janial had completed the Construction Document Technologist (CDT) review course that many of our Chapter's certified members volunteer their time to teach each year at HACC. Along with six other members from our Chapter, I attended the CSI National Convention last month to "learn and earn (professional development hours)" at the many seminars available at the Convention, to see new products and technologies unveiled on the exhibit floor (several hundred enterprises were repre-

ented), to meet new people, and yes, to party a little. In my official capacity as your president, I received the Institute's Outstanding Chapter Commendation - Silver Level at the Institute's Business Meeting. Just to shed some light on how significant this award is, no one has yet reached the next level (Gold), and only ten Chapters have achieved the Silver Level. Fourteen Chapters have achieved the next highest Bronze Level commendation. Only three out of fifteen Chapters in the CSI Mid-Atlantic Region receive the Institute's Outstanding Chapter Commendation, and we were the only Silver Level. It is rewarding to see accomplishment, whether by an individual such as Janial's, or by a group level such as our Chapter's; and it is especially reward-
